# Sleepy Hollow in Plainfield is not Sleepy

There is section of Plainfield known as Sleepy Hollow. Hardly sleepy, this district is an area of charming, quaint, beautifully landscaped neighborhoods with historic homes. To my knowledge there are 5 neighborhoods in Sleepy Hollow with their particular boundaries.

Although becoming familiar with each other, conducting regular meetings and having an executive board, the Neighborhoods also function to help those in need in Plainfield.

For several years the Sleepy Hollow neighborhoods have been "feeding" Star Fish Food Pantry with nonperishable foods and generous monetary donations helping Star Fish sustain the mission of "providing emergency food for the people of Plainfield."

The Crescent Ave District encompasses the Crescent Ave. Presbyterian Church. A constant in donating food, CAPC delivers weekly a car trunk filled with food obtained from their parishioners. In turn, Star Fish donates to the Church, for their Tuesday lunch program the containers of food too large for the families we serve. Its symbiotic! Andre McIntyre and Leslie R make an awesome team.

Sleepy Hollow Neighbors, another neighborhood association, donated this past Christmas \$2,000 in

## Sleepy Hollow (cont'd)


gift cards to Shop Rite supermarket. Lois Dick coordinated the drive. Star Fish gifted 162 individuals and families gift cards a total of \$11,000. Their contribution of cards and money made a financial difference in supporting that event.

The Netherwood Heights Neighbors of Sleepy Hollow contributed to the Pantry an overwhelming amount of food before Thanksgiving. Laura Kayser was the motivating factor in gathering the nutritious items.

Hinting that our need at the time was hot and cold cereal, a Cereal Bowl collection was initiated, collected at Coffee Box cafe on South Ave., and totaled 600 boxes of cereal. Jeff Spellman, owner of Coffee Box, noted that the cereals donated by women were basically those with low sugar amounts including Oatmeal; men dropped off those they favored perhaps during their childhood? For example, Capt'n Crunch, Lucky Charms, Froot Loops, Cocoa Krispies, Sugar Pops. Interesting observation.

The entire neighborhood of Sleepy Hollow Plainfield is full of caring concerned people. Whether you are in the "defined" Sleepy Hollow or its surrounding streets, all of you are truly appreciated for the support you give to Star Fish Food Pantry. That support includes financial giving that helps us maintain our supply of groceries to feed the hungry. We sincerely appreciate all of you and all that you do for your Plainfield neighbors.

We are a group of volunteers from Plainfield and the surrounding area who belong to a tax exempt, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation in existence since 1971. We operate three days each week throughout the year, preparing and distributing grocery food orders to an average of thirty to thirty-five families in need each week.

Our primary function is to maintain the food pantry. Our volunteers pack and deliver grocery food orders to clients who have been referred to us by local social service agencies. Most of these agencies are listed on our website <u>Partners page</u>.

Using a referral system helps us better manage our resources. These agencies vet the client to help assure that our limited resources are given to those truly in need. We also prepare special food orders for 160 families at Easter, Thanksgiving, and at Christmas.

The generosity of our donors helps us prepare these holiday meals and bags of food each week for those in need of emergency food assistance. You are all "Stars for Star Fish!"

## The Food We Provide To Those In Need—Amounts Vary Based on Family Size

- 1 Package of frozen meat
- 1 Loaf of bread
- 1 lb of Pasta
- 1 Pasta Sauce
- 4 Cans Soup
- 2 Macaroni and Cheese
- 1 Small bag of tea bags
- 1 Jar Peanut Butter
- 1 Jar Jelly
- 1 Can of Fruit or Jar of Applesauce
- 4 Cans Vegetables
- 2 Can of Tuna
- 4 Cans of Beans
- 1/2 Dozen Eggs
- 2 box of cereal (or 4 Instant Breakfast Cereal envelopes for single persons)
- 1 dry or shelf-stable milk
- 1 Paper goods, 1 cleaning product, and 1 personal care item
