Wilson Memorial Church: A Partnership in Giving

Moments after entering Wilson Memorial Church for the first time, I noticed a box filled with canned goods next to the podium holding the guest book. This was my introduction to Star Fish, Inc., just over three years ago. Since that day, I have heard many announcements celebrating a monetary donation or a successful toy drive. There have also been requests to help unload trucks or pack boxes.

Star Fish, a non-profit corporation run by volunteers from Plainfield and the surrounding area, is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year. Wilson Memorial Church of Watchung, New Jersey has partnered with Star Fish for many of those years. Donations of food, diapers, school supplies and time, as well as monetary contributions, have been received from Wilson Memorial Church, The Outreach Committee, the Frippery Thrift Shop and individual church members.

Star Fish operates three mornings a week- collecting, preparing and delivering food to those in need. While its primary function is the collection and distribution of food, Star Fish also accepts toiletries, paper products, and other items families typically use.

During the Covid-19 crisis, Star Fish continued to operate on a limited basis. They were able

to supplement weekly food packages provided by the Plainfield Food Security Project initiated by the YMCA. Star Fish also partnered with the Rotary Club of the Plainfields and the DuCret School of Art, providing food to the hungry throughout the pandemic. They are currently supplying 50 bags of food and 150 dozen eggs to Food Security Project.

We are a group of volunteers from Plainfield and the surrounding area who belong to a tax exempt, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation in existence since 1971. We operate three days each week throughout the year, preparing and distributing grocery food orders to an average of thirty to thirty-five families in need each week.

Our primary function is to maintain the food pantry. Our volunteers pack and deliver grocery food orders to clients who have been referred to us by local social service agencies. Most of these agencies are listed on our website <u>Partners page</u>.

Using a referral system helps us better manage our resources. These agencies vet the client to help assure that our limited resources are given to those truly in need. We also prepare special food orders for 160 families at Easter, Thanksgiving, and at Christmas.

The generosity of our donors helps us prepare these holiday meals and bags of food each week for those in need of emergency food assistance. You are all "Stars for Star Fish!"

The Food We Provide To Those In Need—Amounts Vary Based on Family Size

- 1 Package of frozen meat
- 1 Loaf of bread
- 1 lb of Pasta
- 1 Pasta Sauce
- 4 Cans Soup
- 2 Macaroni and Cheese
- 1 Small bag of tea bags
- 1 Jar Peanut Butter
- 1 Jar Jelly
- 1 Can of Fruit or Jar of Applesauce
- 4 Cans Vegetables
- 2 Can of Tuna
- 4 Cans of Beans
- 1/2 Dozen Eggs
- 2 box of cereal (or 4 Instant Breakfast Cere-
- al envelopes for single persons)
- 1 dry or shelf-stable milk
- 1 Paper goods, 1 cleaning product, and 1 personal care item
