A Little History from Kathi DeLucca

Kathi DeLucca was a former director of Star Fish. We thank her for this history and for her years as a volunteer and director.

I was privileged to work alongside Mary Nischwitz (the first director who was a founder along with Eileen Cunniff) starting in 1983. I took over as Director of Star Fish in 1985. I worked with Linda Stanbach and Edna Shanok and many other dedicated volunteers who were on the same 3 day food orders schedule as now.

We bumped into each other in the tiny back room at Covenant United Methodist as we packed bags year round. Other volunteers picked them up and delivered them to the agencies from whom we had been given the family requests. What a blessing of a shared Mission when Covenant later gave us the larger work and storage space!

In addition to our providing emergency food assistance, Linda and Edna operated a children's' clothing "closet" at Washington School in Plainfield with Principal Henry Thompson. When funds allowed, Star-Fish also had an arrangement with Globe Shoes in Plainfield to provide sneakers for residents of the Park Hotel Assisted Living Facility. We were able to purchase blankets and accepted donations of blankets, winter hats and gloves to send with orders in the winter months.

Star Fish was the recipient of the first US Post Office (Letter Carriers) Food Collection program in Plainfield. We didn't know what to expect and were astonished as truck after truck pulled up with bags of donated food. I remember it was a rainy day and some of the boxes and bags got wet. The mountain of food was stacked to the ceiling in a back corner of the great room, outside our panty area. It was wonderful to receive all that food and at the same time overwhelming to wonder how we would be able to organize and store it! As always Covenant was more than accommodating and they allotted us that corner for the extra temporary storage space we

Legacy Gift to Star Fish from Betty B. Willey

Star Fish was recently one of the beneficiaries in the Last Will and Testament of Betty B. Willey who died October 23, 2019. Betty was born in Providence, Rhode Island on July 20, 1924, the daughter of Anne B. Willey and Grafton H. Willey Jr. Betty graduated from CS Lewis College in Massachusetts and went on to get a Masters in Special Education. She taught special needs children in Grandview School in Piscataway for many years.

Betty was a longtime member of the The United Church of Christ, Congregational, Plainfield. She served on every Committee and Board, and was Chair of the Trustees for a long term. Retirement didn't slow Betty down. She continued her work with the church and was a hard working member of the Plainfield Area Habitat for Humanity. She also became a volunteer for NJ Blood Services. She worked on blood drives in the community and also became a regular blood donor herself!

Our former director Marie Pase recalled: "I knew Betty from a few years ago. Peg and I met both her and her house mate Daphne Willard at the United Church of Christ. Both Daphne and Betty were teachers and lived in Plainfield for most of their professional life on Madison Ave. Daphne is still alive and just recently celebrated her 100 birthday. They have both long been supporters of Star Fish. Actually, it was through them and Bea Danyo that I learned of Star Fish and began volunteering. I am not surprised that she remembered Star Fish in her will."

Her bequest, for which we are extremely grateful, totaled almost \$7,000.00.

We are a group of volunteers from Plainfield and the surrounding area who belong to a tax exempt, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation in existence since 1971. We operate three days each week throughout the year, preparing and distributing grocery food orders to an average of thirty to thirty-five families in need each week.

Our primary function is to maintain the food pantry. Our volunteers pack and deliver grocery food orders to clients who have been referred to us by local social service agencies. Most of these agencies are listed on our website <u>Partners page</u>.

Using a referral system helps us better manage our resources. These agencies vet the client to help assure that our limited resources are given to those truly in need. We also prepare special food orders for 160 families at Easter, Thanksgiving, and at Christmas.

The generosity of our donors helps us prepare these holiday meals and bags of food each week for those in need of emergency food assistance. You are all "Stars for Star Fish!"
